## Program Overview and Objectives

The 2017 West Virginia Geriatrics Society Scientific Assembly, “The Aging West Virginian” is designed to enhance the care of the geriatric population and address pressing issues currently on the forefront of geriatric care. **It is designed healthcare professionals, including** physicians, nurses, pharmacists and social workers. This activity will address issues related to hospice care, palliative care, long term care, the issue of opioid addiction and management of pain, plus statistics related to the healthcare professional environment including medically underserved area.
